Registration

All members <u>MUST</u> register online with the Canadian Association for Disabled Skiing (CADS) National for insurance purposes. The annual fee is \$30 per person. If you were a member last year, you will have already received an email from CADS with the link to re-register. If you are new to our program, please go to the <u>CADS website</u> (<u>http://disabledskiing.ca/</u>) and register under the **National Capital Division.** Once you have registered, please send the confirmation email to <u>nicole.m.vanoosten@gmail.com</u>. *You will not be able to ski with our program unless you have completed this process.*

You must also register with Ski Hawks Ottawa through <u>www.Events.com</u>. The site works with newer search engines, such as Google Chrome. However, skiers who use screen readers may prefer using Internet Explorer. If you have any difficulty with the form, please contact Carolyn Mitrow at <u>cmitrow@gmail.com</u> who will be able to assist you.

To begin the registration process:

- 1. Go to <u>www.Events.com</u> (NOTE: Screen reader users should use Internet Explorer for more ease).
- 2. Go to the search engine at the top of the page and type in **Ski Hawks Ottawa**. (The Ski Hawks Ottawa should show up as the first result, at the top left of the page.)
- 3. Click on More details to go to the Ski Hawks Ottawa Registration page.
- 4. On this page, click on the + (plus) sign beside your category (guide or participant)
- Scroll down to the orange REGISTER NOW button. (Note: Screen reader users may not be able to activate the + (plus) button. If this is the case, move forward to the Quantity Edit field and type 1 in to the field. Then you can move down and activate the register button.)
- 6. On the next page, you must fill out the **BUYER INFORMATION** and answer all questions.
- 7. When you are done, click on **SUBMIT ORDER**. You will receive a confirmation via email.

Editor's note: I want to apologize to those who use screen readers. The system is not well designed for those with vision problems. I am working with Events.com staff to try to rectify some of the accessibility issues.

CADS CERTIFICATION

As mentioned above, the CADS-NCD Technical Committee has set all of the training and certification dates for 2016-2017. The focus this year will be to give all of the modules for volunteers to be able to complete either their CADS I or CADS II levels.

For SHO guides, the certification process offers certification flexibility, which wasn't offered under the old certification process. Guides can continue do the full certification at each level (I through IV) as in the past, or, under the new modular system for certification, there are modules for visually impaired (VI) specialization at CADS Level I and II. This new feature now means that SHO guides can take a CADS Level I VI module and then later take a CADS Level II VI module without having to complete all the other CADS modules at Level I or II. If successful at each level you will be recognized as a VI Specialist.

At the Guide Training Session scheduled for December 4 the CADS certification process, and the 2016-17 schedule of training, will be explained. This certification process is not mandatory, but you are encouraged to upgrade your skills. It will be free again this year

SHO will aim to set up a training night before the VI, and 3 and 4 track modules to give our volunteers some experience before the module.

The SHO Board is very supportive of the CADS Technical Committee's direction and has bought PDF and hard copy versions of the CADS Manual that was produced last year. All new guides will receive a manual or a link to the manual upon registration.

Drivers for Wednesday Night



This is our annual plea to have potential drivers contact Murielle Arseneau at <u>marseneau@bell.net</u> if they can drive a skier to the hill. She has done this job for more years than I can count now and is superb at it, but it isn't always easy. Her constant fear is that she won't have enough drivers to get all of the skiers up to the hill. Kim Leahy also assists in this area when Murielle isn't available and she will also need your support when she plans the weekend events.

Please note that if you can only drive a skier one way, that is still a big help to us as we can try and arrange for a driver for the other way. You can let us know about your driving availability on the Ski Hawks registration site or simply tell Murielle.

Skier Weekly Participation

Skiers will be able to confirm their attendance by completing the <u>Weekly Skier Notification Form</u> on our Web site and submitting it before <u>9 p.m. on Sunday</u>. Murielle will collect the notifications at that time and start planning for the following Wednesday.

Retiring Long-Time Volunteers

In 2015, the Board passed a motion to honour retiring volunteers in SHO who have contributed a significant number of years to the program, with a plaque. Past recipients were Mary-Ellen Connolly and Neil Martyniuk. This year a plaque will be awarded to **Ron Prince** who volunteered with Ski Hawks for 40 years. Ron was instrumental in getting the Club up and running. He was also a dedicated driver even though when he wasn't guiding. His guidance, patience and great manner with skiers and guides will be missed.

CADS Annual Festival

The 2017 CADS Festival will be held at Sun Peaks Resort, British Columbia from March 26 - 31, 2017. Attending the festival is an experience of a lifetime for anyone who has never been. You will not be disappointed.

In the event any skiers and or guides wish to go, please advise Mary Johannsen or Jim Dicks as soon as possible so that planning, funding raising and any necessary ski skill development can be facilitated throughout the entire season. If a visually limited skier wants to go <u>they need to find</u> <u>a guide</u> who is willing to go and pay their own way. It is best if skiers and guides go in teams of two or three - 1 skier along with 1 or 2 guides.

For people wishing to attend, the cost per person may range from about \$1,500 to \$2,000 depending on circumstances, transportation, accommodation, meals, equipment rentals if needed, personal incidentals, etc. As was the case in past seasons, CADS - NCD is looking to provide some funding for the festival. Ski Hawks is also budgeting some funds to help partially subsidize anyone going.

Registration for the CADS Festival will be open on the CADS Web site starting on November 1.

2016-2017 Grade 4 & 5 SnowPasses now available

The SnowPass helps to keep kids active during the winter months and is one of Canada's easiest ways to get kids healthy and active. It's an unbeatable offer; it provides 5 free lift passes at each of the 150+ ski areas nation-wide for Canadian kids in Grade 4 and Grade 5.

You only need to apply once for the SnowPass and the pass is valid until the end of Grade 5. This means if you apply in grade 4 the pass is valid for two years.

Safety and Awareness Questionnaire for Guides

With a constant focus on improving the safety of our program, the Board will continue to use the completion of the safety questionnaire as a pre-requisite to guiding each year. The document is intended to be a refresher of the principles of guiding a visually impaired skier or boarder and will perhaps create some discussion on how we do things, that might further improve the program in the future. The questionnaire will be reviewed as a group at the guide training day on December 4th.

Code of Conduct

The Ski Hawks Code of Conduct is a set of guidelines designed to safeguard and ensure that the Ski Hawks activities are held in a safe, respectful and fun environment. As such, all Ski Hawks members, including skiers and guides, are asked to:

1. Be respectful and courteous towards others at all times.

- 2. Act with integrity, impartiality and fairness and behave in such a way that does not endanger or prejudice others.
- 3. Respect the ski area, transportation vehicles and physical environment, including rental equipment.
- 4. Follow safety rules and procedures on the ski hill at all times.
